Perceived Impacts:

- Positive impact on staff confidence, knowledge, and skills in teaching PE and sport.
- Increased pupil engagement in regular physical activity and sport.

The funding has positively impacted sports participation in the following ways:

- Increased pupil engagement: More pupils are regularly participating in physical activities and sports.
- Broader access: A wider and more equal range of sports and physical activities is now available to all pupils.
- Competitive sports: Participation in competitive sports has increased.
- Specific groups targeted:
 - Girls: Participation improved through extra-curricular opportunities, competitions, and specialist activities.

- Disadvantaged pupils: Free before-school activity groups and subsidized clubs have been provided.
- Pupils with SEND or medical conditions: Inclusive PE and sport opportunities have been enhanced through training and data-driven support.

Overall, the funding has led to higher physical activity levels and increased participation in school sports

The funding has had a positive impact on teachers' confidence, knowledge, and competence in teaching PE and school sports. It has helped improve their skills and ability to deliver effective PE lessons and sports activities. There has been an increase in number of staff participating in extra-curricular activities and school sports competitions.

The funding has positively impacted on pupils' engagement in physical activity at lunchtimes.

How improvements will be sustained:

- Continued CPD for staff – Whole staff training on gymnastics from HIAS booked for January 2025
- Continuing to develop OPAL at lunchtime for pupils and continual training for staff
- Continued participation in school sports competitions
- continuing to offer extra-curricular activities
