When on a journey, see if you can spot the whole alphabet around you, one letter at a time. Write your favourite in your book.	Find 4 interesting words in the dictionary and write a poem using them.	Interview a family member or family friend. Write or draw down any interesting information that you find out.	Write your very own set of instructions about how to do something around your house. Include numbered steps and pictures.

Get someone at home to play ‘20 questions’ to see if they can guess your shape.	Make a paper plane and throw it 5 times. Measure how far it travels each time and record it neatly using the correct units of measurement.	Create a game to help you practice your times tables.	Create a timetable for your day including the start and finish times for each activity.	Work with an adult at home and tell the time on an analogue clock a minimum of #10 times. Write the times down in words.
<b>I enjoy being creative, painting, drawing and visualising.</b>	Last term, we created our own cave painting. Create your own using the skills learnt in class.	Create a portrait of a family member using only natural materials you find in your garden or a park.	Turn a character from your favourite book into a sock puppet.	Create your own magic trick. Write down or photograph the steps to follow.	Design your own circus. Label all the different acts and attractions. Then write a description of it.
<b>I enjoy being active and doing hands-on activities.</b>	Learn how to spell your name using British sign language.	Help someone at home to complete a day-to-day job. This could be linked to cooking, cleaning, DIY etc.	If it snows, make your own snowman. If it doesn’t snow, make one using different materials.	Make 4 different origami items.	Plan and complete your own science experiment about something that you are interested in. Record your results.
<b>I enjoy finding out about the world around me.</b>	In your garden or local park, record the different birds you see. Do this at least 3 different times.	Visit or research your local leisure centre. When is it open? What facilities/sports do they offer? Do they have any classes?	Show or describe how the world outside your window looks in winter.	Visit a place in Hampshire that you haven’t been to before. Take photos of your visit and write three things you noticed/learnt.	Find out about stories to do with magic from around the world. Re-tell a story or create a fact file to show what people believed.
