- Parent Workshop 'Meet the SENDCo'. Yesterday we were delighted to welcome 18 parents into school for an informal opportunity to meet our Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENDCo), Mrs Ford. This was a chance to explain a little about how we support children with additional needs, why we are passionate about supporting every child's learning and opportunities in the future for further workshops to continue our partnership work together. These sessions are opportunities to get together with other parents for coffee, biscuits and a chat, while also learning more about our practice and building connections. The next few sessions are currently scheduled for:
